The participation of the C.C.D. Tulcea Team at the second transnational meeting organized within the strategic partnership "Hands-on Development Strategies in the Content-Centered Context for Young and Adult Learners with Poor Basic Skills in Literacy and Numeracy" within the Erasmus + Programme, Vilnius / Lithuania.

Between 26th – 30th October 2015 was held in Vilnius Lithuania the second transnational meeting of the partners involved in the Project of strategic partnership "Hands-on Development Strategies in the Context for Content-Centered Young and Adult Basic Skills in Learners with Poor Literacy and Numeracy "Erasmus +, attended by representatives of the following organizations: Országos Tranzitfoglalkoztatási Egyesület (OTE) - Debrecen / Hungary, Edirne Teknik ve Endüstri Meslek Lisesi - Edirne / Turkey, Centro integrado of Formación professional Medina del Campo - Medina del Campo / Spain and Klaipedos Valstybine kolegija - Klaipeda / Lithuania. The agenda included information about the role, skills and limits of the teachers involved in activities with students with learning difficulties, methods and strategies to address the content in the classroom or in the face to face learning that aim to improve the results of the students' / youth with a low development of the fundamental acquisitions.

The meeting in Vilnius created an opportunity for participants to learn more about the institutions in the partner countries involved in the project, to deepen their knowledge about strategies and methods of working with students with learning difficulties, to discover ways of collaboration in drafting the products that meet the identified needs in order to realize the methodological guide (new methods and tools for teachers). It will be applied in schools in the partner countries and will serve as an example of good practice in the training program for teachers working with students / young people with learning difficulties and / or at risk of dropout and school failure, developed and delivered by the Teachers' Training Center Tulcea, in Romania and Europe.

On the first day of the meeting the team of the Teachers' Training Center Tulcea, led by the director of the institution, Gabriela Nichifor, had a working session with the project coordinator Reka Ökördi, the representative of Országos Tranzitfoglalkoztatási Egyesület (OTE) - Debrecen / Hungary, in order to discuss details related to the tasks of the Teachers' Training Center Tulcea, the realisation of the training program to be delivered to a target group of 10 teachers from Romania in face to face format and online for 20 teachers from European countries.
